

**Week Three | Sunday, January 17, 2010****“Busted”**
Romans 1:18-20

1. Do you remember a time when you felt that your anger was justified (a righteous anger)?
2. Why do you believe that people/we tend to not think that God would be justified in being angry (having a righteous anger)?
3. READ Romans 1:18-20 and answer “why is God justified in expressing anger towards people?”
4. The Apostle Paul tells us that creation reveals God’s eternal power and divine nature. Talk about some of the ways that the intricacies of nature show these characteristics of God. From your perspective how does creation reveal God?
5. The Apostle Paul says that “we are without excuse” and then again in Romans 3:11 that “no one seeks after God”? To what extent do you believe this is true? Why?
6. Fortunately God creates a solution to his own righteous anger. Note that 1:18-32 (God’s wrath revealed) creates a rationale for why 1:16-17 is such good news (God’s righteousness revealed). In your own words describe God’s solution to his wrath.
7. What do people who reject God as creator of the world need? How does this impact your interaction with them?
8. What role do you think creation arguments play in helping people express faith in Jesus? Are they important? Why or why not?
