1. Why do you suppose that some people feel really awkward talking about sex? To what extent do you believe that we should feel awkward talking about it with one another?
2. Pastor Earl said that God sees sex between a husband and a wife as sacred and beautiful. What do you think about that?
3. Sex is more than just physical; it is spiritual. Genesis 1:27 and 2:24 tell us that marital “oneness” is similar (but not equal) to God’s oneness. First Corinthians 6:19-20 reminds us that the Holy Spirit is present in sex. What are the implications of this truth for a husband and a wife?
4. Why is it important that sex be for the marriage relationship alone? Look up Hebrews 13:4, and discuss this verse. How is this teaching different from the perspective of contemporary culture?
5. Pastor Earl said that sex is exhilarating, that it is something married couples should enjoy. Why is it important that sex be enjoyed?
6. Sex is also a means of grace. What does 1 Corinthians 7:5 teach us about the importance of sex and spiritual warfare?
7. Of all the things that you can talk about in life, when you talk about sex, it is so much more than just about sex. First Corinthians 7:4 instructs us that sex is all about seeking out the joy of the other, and we do that when we meet each other’s needs.
