**“Big Enough to Work In and Through Me”
2 Kings 1 and 2**

1. Share a story in your life where you really sensed that God was working in or through you.
2. Review the story of 2 Kings 2 and the key question of “Where is the Lord, the God of Elijah?”
 - a. NOTE – Elisha is making a statement of confidence. He knows that God is with him.
3. Why do you think so many people lack the confidence that God is working in and through them?
4. What biblical advice would you give someone who is struggling with this?
 - a. NOTE
 - i. Jesus words in John 14-16; Luke’s record in Acts 1:8; Paul’s words in Galatians 2:20; Peter’s words in 2 Peter 1:3
5. Sin is a major obstacle towards confidence in God working in and through us. What are some different examples of sin that impact our confidence?
6. Earl, talked about a “worship disorder” – not having Father, Son and Spirit at the center of our lives but having other things (good things sometimes that morph into ultimate things) at the center. Discuss how a good thing like “family” morph into an ultimate thing? Discuss how a good thing like “work” can morph into an ultimate thing? Ask if anyone else has another example.
7. How do these other things impact my identity or my desire to grow spiritually?
8. Allow time for everyone in the group to share about how they are sensing right now that God is indeed working in or through them. This may be an opportunity for members in the group to speak into each other’s lives. Sometimes it is hard to see it ourselves but others have a unique perspective.
